



Dear Guest,

Welcome to Manor! We are thrilled to have you with us and we hope you truly enjoy your experience at Manor Country Club. The following information is provided to make your visit to Manor Country Club an enjoyable one.

GENERAL CLUB POLICIES

1. Children under the age of twelve must be in the care and control of an adult at all times while on Club grounds.
2. Smoking is Prohibited inside & outside of the clubhouse with the following exceptions: cigarette smoking is permitted on the golf course, Club Room, & Ballroom outdoor patios, the designated area at the adult only lap pool and the tennis deck.

CELLULAR DEVICE POLICY

1. Cellular devices must be set on vibrate while at the Club and, with discretion and consideration for others, may be used for texting and checking messages.
2. Cellular devices for voice calls are only allowed in outside Club spaces (except for the Golf Course, Tennis Courts, main Patio, Manor Dining Room Terrace, and Lounge Balcony)
3. Speakerphone mode is strictly prohibited anywhere on Club premises

PARKING

Vehicles shall not be parked or be left unattended in front of the clubhouse or at any entrance or in any of the driveways serving the Club. Members and Guest are cautioned to drive vehicles slowly and with great care around the Club grounds. Vehicles must be parked within the lined parking spaces of the parking areas. Vehicles in violation of the parking restrictions will be TOWED from the Club property at the expense of the vehicle owner.

CLUBHOUSE DRESS CODE

1. It is the intent of Manor Country Club to create a generally relaxed, family atmosphere while maintaining a sense of style and dignity in keeping with the tradition of our Club. To that end, members shall observe the rules pertaining to appropriate attire for specific areas of the Club. The General Manager may suspend or adjust these rules in unusual circumstances or because of special arrangements for functions or events. In general, the lower level of the Clubhouse is more casual than the upper level. Members are asked to adhere to this general guideline.

After participating in a sporting activity members and their guests are asked to be considerate of their fellow members enjoying the Manor facilities and wear fresh attire in the various dining facilities.

2. **Unacceptable Attire.** Unacceptable attire in the Clubhouse, on the patio and at Club or member sponsored parties includes: sweat suits, basketball shorts, gym shorts, sweat pants, T-Shirts, collarless shirts, tank tops, bathing suits, and short shorts and cut-offs. Any torn or tattered clothing is also unacceptable.
3. **Tennis and Athletic Attire.** Not acceptable in the upper level of the clubhouse after 5:00 p.m. Prior to 5:00 p.m., only tasteful Tennis attire is permitted, not to include sweat suits and sweat shirts.
4. **Acceptable Attire.** Women may wear collarless shirts and other types of fashions sold in the golf shops at private country clubs.
5. **Blue Jeans** (pants) are permitted to be worn in the Clubhouse including the patios, Club Room and Trophy Lounge and in the Manor Dining Room and Lounge. They are not allowed on the golf course or practice facilities.
6. **Bathing suits** are not permitted anywhere outside of the Pool Complex. Cover-ups or street clothing and shoes or sandals must be worn by members and guests of all ages whenever going between their cars and the Pool complex.

7. **Exercise Attire.** Following an exercise workout, members are to proceed to their lockers or cars. If the member wishes to remain in the Clubhouse or on the clubhouse grounds, appropriate attire, as described in the Dress Code Regulations, must be worn.
8. **Hats.** Baseball type hats are not permitted to be worn by members or their guests in any dining area of the Club except the lower floor of the clubhouse and on the patios and must always be worn with the brim facing forward.
9. **Shoes.** Shoes are to be worn on Club property at all times except inside the pool area, locker rooms and shower facilities. Golf shoes with metal spikes are not permitted.
10. **Management Responsibilities.** Any member or guest, not appropriately attired shall be advised by Club management and requested to either comply with the Dress Code or leave the premises.
11. Management will refuse service to those who will not respect the Manor Dress Code. The General Manager will advise the Board of Governors and House Committee Chairperson of any infractions of the Dress Code not resolved by Club management.

GOLF DRESS CODE

All golfers and spectators on the golf course and the practice areas must wear proper golf attire.

The interpretation of proper golf attire will be based on the fashion worn by men and lady golf professionals and the type of fashion sold in PGA Golf Shops and worn at private country clubs.

1. Collared shirts must be worn and tucked-into pants, trousers or shorts.
2. Turtleneck and mock turtleneck shirts may be worn.
3. Bare feet are not permitted.
4. Sweat suits, swimsuits, cut-offs, athletic shorts, blue denim jeans, T-shirts and tennis outfits are not considered proper golf attire and will not be allowed on the golf course or practice facilities.
5. If a hat is worn, the brim will be ***facing forward***.
6. Profane or suggestive language or inappropriate logos are not permitted.

Proper Golf Attire is available at the Manor Golf Shop.

TENNIS DRESS CODE

1. **Women:** Tube tops and bare midriffs are not allowed.
2. **Men:** Collar shirts or high fashion "dri-fabric" shirts similar to those shown in our pro shop and shops at other private country clubs are required. Cotton T-Shirts and sleeveless shirts are not permitted.
3. **Juniors:** Expected to adhere to this policy also with some weekday exceptions to include T-shirts that are primarily white and tennis oriented; and shorts, with pockets, that do not hang below the knees. Logo T-shirts will also be permitted for juniors on weekends.
4. No jogging shoes, golf shoes, or hard sole shoes are allowed on the court.
5. Persons in swimming attire or golf spikes are not permitted in the area of the tennis courts or the deck.

In general, the interpretation of proper attire will be based on the fashion worn by men and women tennis professionals and the type of fashion sold in tennis shops at private country clubs. Be aware that some of the tennis companies are showing tennis attire that is not appropriate for Manor Country Club

The professional staff has instructions to see that there are no violations of this code. All of our members and guests will cooperate with the staff in enforcing this code and will bring to the attention of the staff or Golf/Tennis Committee any one who does not comply with the intent of this code. Any infractions are subject to review and disciplinary action.
